## **Wish List - Ongoing**

- Clean appliances in good working order:
  - **Minifridges** – prefer sizes less than 22 inches wide by 28 inches tall, but others will be considered
  - **Microwaves** – prefer sizes less than 22 inches wide by 14 inches tall, but others will be considered
  - **Televisions** – prefer modern/flat-screen variety for space/ease of moving
  - **Electric kettles** – any size
  - **Propane outdoor grill**
  - **Grill utensils**
- **Toiletries** (shampoo, conditioner, soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, razors)
- **Cleaning supplies**
- **Bath Towels and Washcloths**
- **Kitchen Items:**
  - Pots & pans
  - Plates
  - Glasses
  - Silverware
  - Utensils
  - Tupperware
  - Paper towels
  - Cooking staples (salt, pepper, sugar, spices, cooking oil, etc.) and non-perishable food items
  - Coffee and tea

## **Who we serve:**

Single adults over 21 years of age who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, or living in substandard conditions. Couples and pregnant women are considered on a case-by-case basis. We cannot house families at this time, but may be able to offer them other services, activities, and classes. Eligibility priority is given to veterans, seniors, and underemployed/low-wage workers who need housing in order to retain employment.
